Richard Nolley "Dick" DeVilbiss, 94, of Timonium passed away on February 7, 2021. He is preceded in death by Audrey Ann DeVilbiss, his beloved wife of 40 years, his brother, William C. DeVilbiss and his parents, Charles B. DeVilbiss and Margaret C. DeVilbiss.

He was a loving father to Richard N. DeVilbiss, Jr. and his wife Nancy, S. Brooke DeVilbiss, D'Arcy D. Cook, Margaret D. DeLuca, step-children Patrick J. McCann and Colleen Cericola. He leaves behind 9 grandchildren, 1 great-grandchild, 4 nephews and their families.

Mr. DeVilbiss served in the Navy during World War II. He graduated from Loyola High School in 1944 and Loyola (College) University in 1949 where he played varsity lacrosse. He spent most of his career at DeVilbiss Printing, a family business which he, along with his father and brother, founded in 1959. He retired in 2000 while serving as president of the company. He had interests in wine and gemology. Dick was an avid golfer throughout his life and in 1999 was a founding member of the "new" Country Club of Maryland. He volunteered with Alley Animals, an animal rescue organization, from 1980 to 2017 and at Mercy Ridge, calling bingo at St. Stephen's Green from 2014 until 2020 and moderating the Monday Morning Bridge Club from 2018 until 2020.
