



Dr. Alberto Jose Diaz

March 2, 1934 - May 8, 2023

Alberto J Diaz, M.D. died peacefully on May 8, 2023. He was 89.

A long time resident of Towson, Dr Diaz was born in the Dominican Republic. He obtained his medical degree there and came to Camden, N.J. in 1957 for his internship and another year at Glenn Dale Federal Hospital before further training at Union Memorial Hospital in Baltimore. Dr Diaz received a Masters in International Public Health from Johns Hopkins in 1968. Following a one year stay in Chile working with Hopkins physicians on a health care study in Chile, he returned to Baltimore and worked for the development of the West Baltimore Community Health Center. He began his private practice in Towson in 1973 and retired in 2015.

He is survived by his wife Marliese and daughter, Maria Helena, a sister Andreina Goldberg of San Francisco, a brother Alfonso of Timonium; eight nieces and nephews, Alberto, Lisa, Julia, Jon, Joseph, Janine, Stefan and Lindsay and also great nieces and nephews and many cousins here and in the Dominican Republic.

Dr. Diaz will be interred in his beloved hometown of La Vega in the Dominican Republic.
