On April 12, 2025, Ascanio "Scon" Silvio Boccuti died peacefully in his home. Scon graduated from McDonogh School in 1957 and Cornell University in 1961, where he met his future wife, Jean. He continued his education at Georgetown University Law Center, graduating in 1964. After two years in the Army, he joined the trust department of Mercantile Bank and Trust Company. In 1966, he became a member of Whiteford Taylor & Preston, where he practiced law for over 30 years. During this time, he became a Fellow of the

American College of Trusts and Counsel.

Scon treated his family, friends, neighbors, and colleagues with genuine honesty and integrity. He will be profoundly missed by the many who loved him.
