Mrs. Barbara Cummings, age 84, died peacefully at her home of 52 years in Towson, Maryland, on Sunday, June 7, 2026, after battling a series of long-term illnesses.

She was the loving wife of her late husband, Alex; the wonderful mother of Dan, Maria, Trish, and Dave; the supportive grandmother of Lauren, Kevin,

Megan, Caroline, Colin, Bridget, Lucia, and Blake; and the special great-grandmother of Billy and Teddy.

Mrs. Cummings' education included Immaculate Conception School and Mt. St. Agnes High School, and after graduating from Villa Julie College she began her career as a secretary and the only female employee of the professional ice hockey team, the Baltimore Clippers, in the 1960s.

Mrs. Cummings was especially known for her role as a homemaker to her four children, displaying her enthusiastic personality while attending all of their school events and sports activities. She was a dedicated fan, cheering on her children and grandchildren in whatever sports they were playing at the time. She especially loved watching Dan and Dave, and later Kevin and Colin, play lacrosse at Loyola Blakefield, located on the same street as her childhood home on Chestnut Avenue. While her primary role was that of homemaker, she later worked as an assistant teacher in the two-year-old program at Grace Preschool. Mrs. Cummings was loved by the children, their parents, and her fellow faculty members for her patience, warmth, and commitment to everyone she served. She also worked as a sales associate at the Pied Piper children's clothing store.

Mrs. Cummings also enjoyed a variety of hobbies, including ice skating with her older sister, Mary Ann, and her brother, Bill, playing bridge, hosting parties, knitting, and attending fashion shows. She loved serving others in the community by volunteering at Immaculate Conception Church and Our Daily Bread. In her later years, Barbara enjoyed completing word-search books and watching television shows from her favorite sunroom.

Mrs. Cummings' warm heart and beautiful smile reflected her outgoing personality. She maintained lifelong friendships while also making new friends wherever she went. So well known throughout the community, she earned the

nickname "Mayor of Towson." She enjoyed conversations with people from all walks of life and always expressed a genuine interest in the well-being of others.

Mrs. Cummings was a true believer in faith, family, and friendship. She inspired others to treat people with kindness and compassion and will always be remembered for her gratitude, thoughtfulness, and care for others.

Some of her most cherished memories were family vacations to Ocean City, Maryland and Rehoboth Beach, Delaware. She loved sweet treats, especially ice cream and chocolate, Graul's chicken salad, Johnny Dee's famous shrimp salad and Diet Coke, which remained her favorite beverage until the very end. Despite suffering from a variety of medical conditions, Mrs. Cummings left a lasting impression as a truly courageous woman, even in her final days.
