She was born in Baltimore, Maryland on December 27, 1926. Her father, Stuart Windsor, was a successful insurance executive, rising to be the Chairman of one of Maryland's largest insurance brokerages, RCM&D. Her mother, Elsa Q. Windsor, was a homemaker.

She attended Eastern High School and graduated from the University of Maryland with a degree in art.

Two weeks after graduating from college, Bettie married Gordon A. Gaumnitz at the Church of Redeemer in Baltimore, Maryland on June 26, 1948. Together they opened Gordon Florist which was truly a family business where all of the family spent time working over many years. Gordon died in 1975.

Bettie was an avid tennis player, life long bridge player and passionate artist. She painted all of her grandchildren and the collection was displayed at the Woman's Club of Roland Park, where she was a member. Bettie was also a 50+ year member of the Baltimore Country Club where she enjoyed attending the annual fashion show with her daughters and granddaughters. She married John Crow in 1976. He was a wonderful grandfather to her six grandchildren.

After John died in 2012, Bettie moved to Blakehurst in Towson, Maryland. During the COVID epidemic, Bettie painted portraits of her closest friends which were later displayed at a Blakehurst Art Show.
