Born January 10, 1941 in Federalsburg, Maryland to Lambertine and Reta (Cummings) Bradley, Brenda was the 7th of 8 children raised on a chicken farm. Brenda attended Federalsburg High School and was crowned Miss Federalsburg in 1958. She attended Towson State Teachers College and earned a degree in Physical Education.

Following a brief stint as a P.E. teacher Brenda was instrumental in the creation of the Baltimore Board of Officials for Women's Sports (BBOWS). As the Executive Director Brenda assigned officials for all girls' and women's sports in Baltimore County and Baltimore City High Schools. She later became the Commissioner of the Maryland Intercollegiate Board of Officials for Women's Sports and the Supervisor of Women's Basketball Officials for the Colonial Athletic Association. She was a National Division I volleyball official. She recruited, trained, assigned and evaluated college basketball officials and served on NCAA committees

Brenda was passionate about girls' and women's sports, her family and her Eastern Shore roots. She had a very green thumb and enjoyed gardening, sewing and DIY projects of any kind. A loving wife, mother and grandmother she cherished her time with her 13 grandchildren

We all had our officials ratings and actually were hired by the schools in our Junior and senior years.

At that time, all schools having girls' sports had to find their own officials. A short time after graduation, I remember sitting in the basement of one of the buildings at Roland Park with Brenda, Joann Murray and others as we hammered out the start of the BBOWS. Not sure if BBOWS would have ever developed without the masterful leadership of Brenda. If I looked real hard, I am sure I could find the 8MM cassette tape of this meeting.

How I relish the talks we have had over the years! Brenda was passionate, forthright and loved her officials and her family!

As coaches, we knew never to call Brenda about any official if we had lost the game! Officials (and I was one in my younger years) had a true advocate in Brenda...she had their backs and yet she was the ultimate teacher and could improve their performance.

She was direct, passionate to improve officiating, funny and gave the players a better experience.

A Sunpapers article appeared when Brenda was in Gymnastics class at Towson. She was on the balance beam and little known to most, she was carrying her first born. We have laughed many times over this picture.

My friend, Brenda, loved her family more than anything!

Thank you all Gelstons for sharing your Mom with so many people! She was so special!
