



Sr. Dianne Livingstone

October 1, 1944 - May 23, 2019

Sister Dianne Livingstone, a member of the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart for 42 years, died at Stella Maris Hospice in Baltimore County on May 23.

Sister Dianne was born in Youngstown, Ohio, and raised in Salisbury, on Maryland's Eastern Shore. She attended Wicomico High School and Salisbury State College, and was a Pharmacy Technician at Peninsula General Hospital before joining the Mission Helpers Community in 1977.

Her missions included a New York City Latino community and an Arizona church where she was one of the first parish administrators in the country. She served in the Diocese of Youngstown, Ohio, and in parishes in Warren, Ohio; Wilmington, Delaware; and Chestertown, Maryland.

Sister Dianne was predeceased by a sister, Nancy Livingstone, and is survived by sisters Anne Riley Taylor and Mary Buller, numerous nieces and nephews, her Mission Helper Sisters, family, and friends.
