“ I, like the Spicer daughters, had the wonderful opportunity to have a stay at home mom. We of course did not recognize what a luxury this would eventually become. Mrs. Spicer's death is another bringing to a close a very different and special era. That period might be difficult to explain to people today, but the loss of our parents' generation brings a deep sadness to those of us who grew up then. I always enjoyed talking to Mrs. Spicer as she would remind me of this growing up. She had a warm and welcoming smile for visitors, and a great combination of humor and practicality in her conversation. I also don't want to forget how impressed I was with her artistic talents. This was slowly revealed to me over the years... The Madeline painting, the celebration of Nancy's birth with the clown and the blocks watercolor, the neighborhood sign she painted and having the opportunity to see some of her early portfolio pieces from her commercial artist days after the Maryland Institute.
