October 6, 1940 - June 24, 2023

Dr. Frank S. Palmisano Jr., 82, of Towson, Maryland, passed away on June 24, 2023.

Frank was born on October 6, 1940 to Frank and Alberta Palmisano in Danville, PA. Frank attended St. Dominic School and was a graduate of Loyola High School Blakefield, Loyola College, and the University of Maryland School of Medicine.

After graduating with a degree in medicine, he interned at Union Memorial Hospital in Baltimore, MD. He was drafted into the U.S. Army, served honorably as a captain overseas in Korea, and was part of the receiving team responsible for examining the health of the crew who had been aboard the U.S.S. Pueblo when it was taken captive by North Korea.

Upon returning to the United States, he worked as a general practitioner in Rosedale, MD for 11 years and eventually opened his own private practice in the Hamilton neighborhood of Baltimore City where he served the community for 36 years.

In 1974, he met and married Linda Palmisano (nee Pechulis). The two remained faithfully together for 49 years.

He is survived by his wife Linda, and three children Trey, Chris, and Leah, along with his daughter-in-law Krista, son-in-law Clay, brother Robert, and sister-in-law Cristina, as well as his eight grandchildren Isabelle, Lexi, Laurel, Sam, Juliet, Blake, Alex, and Lila.

He leaves behind many friends, family, and patients whom he touched with his kindness throughout the years.
