



Mrs. Jean Carter Cyphers

November 29, 1933 - October 19, 2017

Jean Carter Cyphers, who was born on November 29, 1933 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland to parents, Colvin and Hulda Carter, died of a long-term illness on October 19, 2017 in Towson, Maryland. She lived all but twelve years of her life in the Stoneleigh neighborhood of south Towson, graduating from Towson High School in 1951, and from Towson State Teachers College in 1955.

In 1954, Jean married John "Jack" Cyphers, a union which produced three children. She was a devoted wife, a devout Christian, a loving mother, a lover of the outdoors and animals, a volunteer for the less fortunate at the Assistance Center in Towson, an avid bridge player, a loyal friend, and a kind-hearted grandmother to her nine grandchildren.

Jean and Jack spent their summers at Saylor's Lake in northeast Pennsylvania. The Lake was their favorite place, Jean could be found enjoying a refreshing swim in the spring-fed lake, or taking in a picturesque sunset on a boat ride with her husband, almost always accompanied by a dog. She loved to cook and camp and take walks around the lake and through Stoneleigh. She also taught middle school prior to starting her family, and continued as a substitute teacher most of her life.

Jean is survived by her son, John C. Cyphers and wife, Carol, son Mike C. Cyphers and wife, Judy, granddaughter Erin Greenhalgh and husband, Tighe, grandson Tim Cyphers and wife, Madeline, grandsons Dan Adamiak, Kyle, Eric, Paul, and Bryan Cyphers, Matt Adamiak and wife, Madeline, and Andrew

Cyphers. Also survived by her son-in-law, Dave Adamiak, and three great grandchildren, Nate, Sam and Tess Greenhalgh. Her daughter, Laura Jean Adamiak, pre-deceased her in July 1999.
