



## Mr. Jeffrey Paul Fick

March 23, 1953 - June 2, 2021

Jeffrey Fick (1953–2021)

On Wednesday, June 2, 2021, Jeffrey Paul Fick, 68, of Timonium, MD, died peacefully in his home after a long illness. Born and raised in Baltimore, Jeffrey was a graduate of Calvert Hall College and Villanova University. He played golf at Calvert Hall and Villanova University, and was the captain of the ice hockey team at Villanova. Jeffrey married his high school sweetheart, Page, in 1974 and started their family shortly after.

The self-proclaimed “Great Jumbolini” had both a big presence and big heart, and he brought his greatness to everything he did, especially his love and pride for his family and his passion for golf. Jeffrey competed in golf tournaments his entire life. The highlights of his golf career include his appearances in the televised PGA long drive tournaments in 1981 and 1982, finishing runner up in 1981. Despite moving into other careers, including owning several franchises of Nevada Bob’s in MD and VA and serving as Vice President for the family’s Fick Brothers Roofing Company, he never lost his passion for the sport. He enjoyed spending his weekends at the Country Club of Maryland playing rounds of golf with friends and in 2016 winning the title of Senior Club Champion. In 2017, he was honored with an induction into the Calvert Hall College Hall of Fame.

After the diagnosis of two of his children with cystic fibrosis, Jeffrey poured his passion into CF awareness and fundraising. He served as the Cystic Fibrosis Maryland Chapter President from 1983-1985 and raised substantial money through fundraising events for the chapter. Following the death of his beloved daughter, Tyler, in 2003, Jeffrey devoted himself to continuing her memory through the Tyler P. Fick Foundation, including scholarship funds to her high school, Maryvale Preparatory School, and sending Tyler’s inspirational writings to friends and family. Tyler’s memory toured around the world, as friends and family proudly wore their “Where in the World is T-Bird” t-shirts and posting pictures to social media.

Friends and family will never forget the firework shows on the Fick property that would

rival Baltimore city's own displays on special holidays. While capturing the excitement and imaginations of the extended families' young children, he also caught the attention of local law enforcement, who politely asked him to refrain from his professional-level firework shows. As Jeffrey loved to say, "that's life in the big city."

Jeffrey never forgot a birthday...or anniversary, or other major event in the lives of his friends and family. Like clockwork, we would receive his computer-animated greetings printed on recycled paper from work. He always made sure we knew we were on his mind and he loved us.

In his final years, Jeffrey enjoyed semi-retirement with Page, traveling and spending the cold winters on the warm sunny beaches of Florida. He will be remembered as the Fick family's loving and caring patriarch, devoted to his wife, children, and grandchildren.

Jeffrey is survived by his wife of forty-six years, Page Radebaugh Fick, son Jason Carroll Fick, Ph.D., daughter-in-law Kimary Elizabeth Fick, Ph.D., daughter Jordan Elizabeth Fick, and his grandchildren Austin Tyler Fick and Ryan Joseph Fick. He is preceded in death by his daughter, Tyler Page Fick.

Donations will be accepted to the Tyler P. Fick Scholarship Fund, Maryvale Preparatory School in Maryland. A memorial mass will be held on Saturday, June 26 at 11:00am at Immaculate Conception Church.
