Proud of his Irish heritage on St. Patrick's Day he said, "Everyone was either Irish or wished that they were". Because of him I know the FDR died on April 12th and that the nation mourned his passing. The last time that I saw him he was still a teachers association representative. He was leave Poly after a meeting. At the time, I was the history department head at Poly. He remembered me and seemed to take joy in the fact that I was teaching and United States history. Happy too that I recognized him. I have a feeling that none of his students could have forgotten him. He was very special!*
