And when I was worried about that daughter, Linda would call her and make her come to Linda’s house, under the guise of picking up school supplies, but really so Linda could check her out and make sure she was ok — Linda’s idea, not mine, but I sure appreciated it!

Linda was also the one I relied on to help with my mom and my dad when I needed extra hands or when an emergency came up. I knew I could depend on her!
