On Monday July 4th, M. Jaye Crooks (nee Frederick) of Towson MD entered into eternal rest after a two-year battle with cancer.

Mrs. Crooks is survived by her husband of 56 years, Dr. Edwin Crooks, her son John Crooks of Baltimore MD, her daughter-in-law Elizabeth (Lil) Gurney, her daughter Jill Crooks Karpovich, her son-in-law Todd Karpovich, and two granddaughters, Wyeth and Marta Karpovich, all of Towson. She served as an Elder and Deacon at Second Presbyterian Church where she and her husband were members for 46 years.

A native of the Northwood community in Baltimore, Mrs. Crooks was a 1963 graduate of Eastern High School, a 1978 graduate of Towson University, and continued her education at St. Mary's Ecumenical Institute and the College of Notre Dame.
