“ *Sister Vincent, dear, dear Sr. Vincent. Its hard to know where to start. She was such a force in my life. I attended Rosati Kain High School from '76-'80 -- and what a time to be there! The joy Vincent brought to my life, the inspiration, wisdom, patience, Sr. Gerald and Sr. Vincent made me believe I could do anything. They deconstructed my grade school ideas of art and replaced that with an appreciation not just for talent - because talent is finicky - but about devoting yourself to what you are doing. They preached the pure love of lines, letters, alphabets, and colors. Everyone in their classes prospered. Not just the students who came thinking art was their future - everyone. Vincent could be tough, she didn't coddle laziness, but she was also devoted and her toughness just made you want to work harder. Whether it be teaching freshman contour line drawings of the trash cans in the alley, or seniors silk screening their graduation announcements. Carving alphabets out of erasers and hand stamping long, long verses (if you messed up just one letter, it was time to start over). Sr. Vincent was a student of the great Corita Kent, and she and Sr. Gerald embodied that same greatness.*
