Norman Charles Molz was born in Baltimore, MD on February 27, 1929, the son of Mary Amanda Gaisser of Cincinnati, OH, and Edward F. Molz, of Baltimore, MD. His sister Jeanne Kuhn Hand lives in Winter Park, FL. He is predeceased by his brother Kenneth F. Molz.

Norman graduated after three years from Loyola College in Baltimore with a degree in Physics. He joined the Army as a reservist and was sent to Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX, for three months of basic training. Norman returned to Maryland in December, 1952, to marry his wife of more than 67 years, Mary Suzanne Blakely. After honeymooning in New York,

Norman and Suzi moved to St. Louis, MO, before Norman received military orders to move to Belleville, IL. Norman joined the Air Force Reserve as direct commission and was then a member of the Air National Guard for 13 years. After leaving the service, Norman and Suzi moved back to Maryland. Upon their return, Norman was first employed by Dixie Manufacturing, a steel fabrication company, before working for Martin Marietta, where Norman marketed technical instrumentation to local companies. While with Martin Marietta, Norman was a salesman with limited travel. He then worked for a short time for CEC (Consolidated Engineering Company). Norman worked for Dixie, Martin Marietta and CEC for a total of 11 years combined before starting an almost-30-year career with Westinghouse in 1963. When given a choice, Norman chose to work in the Westinghouse home office, near BWI Airport, in the marketing division, rather than work in various Westinghouse field offices. This decision was the beginning of extensive travel. Norman worked as a Marketing Manager, marketing Westinghouse's AWACS (Airborne Warning and Control System) radar system, which was used by NATO and several Air Forces around the world. During his career with Westinghouse, Norman was transferred to the London office from 1977 to 1979, the beginning of international travel, which included Europe, South America, the Middle East and India. Suzi was often able to accompany Norman and they were often seen at work-related events such as the Paris Air Show and the British Royal Ascot races. During his work-related travels, he and Suzi developed many friendships with business contacts, friendships that often spanned decades. After retiring from Westinghouse in 1992, Norman and Suzi divided their time between Ft. Pierce, FL, and Annapolis, MD, before moving to Oak Crest retirement community in Parkville, MD, in 2017.

Norman born in and raised in a house on 34th Street in Baltimore, MD, across from the former Memorial Stadium.

He attended St. Bernard grade school and Loyola High School.

He met Suzi in Ocean City, MD with a group of Loyola College friends who were socializing with Suzi's friends from College of Notre Dame.

He was passionate about sailing and owned 2 different sailboats. He sailed a trawler with a friend from MD to FL after summer sailing season and enjoyed several sailing vacations with family and friends in the Virgin Islands.

His primary pleasure was being with family as he was most proud of his 8 children and thoroughly enjoyed picking crabs with all of them. He enjoyed serving others through home visits, faith sharing and companionship, reading, Bible study, served as cantor at Blessed Sacrament Church in Waverly, prison ministry, and exercising to stay in shape.

After moving to Guilford, he and Suzi were active parishioners at Cathedral of Mary Our Queen. They enjoyed travelling, the Westinghouse retirement group, Loyola College alumni affairs. From Guilford they moved to London, Severna Park and then Millersville. In recent years, he and Suzi moved to Oak Crest and he enjoyed the men's reading club.
