



Norman Vincent Waltjen

January 19, 1921 - October 17, 2010

Norman V. Waltjen, Jr. of Baltimore, Md. passed away on October 17, 2010 at Union Memorial Hospital from congestive heart failure. He was born July 5, 1921 to the late Norman V. Waltjen, Sr. and Mary Magdalene Waltjen. Mr. Waltjen attended Mount Washington Country School and Loyola High School, graduating in 1938. He entered Loyola College and learned to fly, ultimately becoming a flight instructor and chief pilot. He graduated cum laude from Loyola College in 1942. Mr. Waltjen received a direct commission in the Navy in World War II and was released from active duty in 1946. He stayed with the Naval Reserve until he completed twenty years of service and retired as a Lieutenant Commander. Norman received his law degree from the University of Maryland. In 1950, Mr. Waltjen went into a law partnership with William Donald Schaefer and Mary Arabian. The firm was dissolved when Schaefer entered politics and Arabian became a judge. Norman then became Vice President (legal) of Charles Center- Inner Harbor Management, Inc., a position he retained for 28 years. He also served as President of Loyola College Alumni and was a trustee of the college. In 2004, Norman moved to the Brightwood Retirement Community where he was on the Board of Directors. In 2009, he was elected President, a position he held until his death. Mr. Waltjen was preceded in death by his wife of forty-six years, Catherine (Kay) Waltjen, and brothers Frank Brown and Jerome Gregory Waltjen. He is survived by three nieces on his wife's side of the family and nephews Gregory William Waltjen, Richard L. Waltjen, Christopher N. Waltjen

and Stephen J. Waltjen and his niece, Madelaine Waltjen Shedlick.rnrn rnrn
