



Mr. Philip Burg Jahncke

December 1, 1918 - April 20, 2016

Philip Burg Jahncke of Baltimore, son of Otto and Olga Jahncke, died at the age of 97 on April 20, 2016 of heart failure. He was born on December 1, 1918. He grew up in New Orleans, Louisiana and, no matter how far away from there he was, he always called it home.

At Tulane University, he distinguished himself as a member of the varsity football team, was a member of the Delta Tau Delta fraternity, and was elected class president of his freshman and sophomore classes.

He pursued a military career after college, serving during World War II, and was discharged as a Captain in 1946.

After his military service, Philip Jahncke had a successful career as an executive in the building supply industry, working in Louisiana, Texas, New York and Maryland over a forty-year period. In addition, he also worked in partnership with his wife participating in many aspects of her early American antique furniture business.

Philip Jahncke was married in 1941 to Elizabeth Katrine Rogers, who predeceased him in 2007. He is survived by his son, Philip Roger Jahncke, of New York, NY, and his daughter, Ann Naito Haney, of Baltimore, MD. He was the beloved grandfather to Elizabeth Jahncke Carroll, Alison Jahncke and

Ramsey Naito Winter. He was the proud great-grandfather of Jack, Henry, Antonio, Oscar, Toby and Jules.

Living the last ten years at Roland Park Place in Baltimore opened up to him a new community of friends and a satisfying way of life that he very much enjoyed.
